Rebuilding Collaboration Five Keys and Able Disabled Advocacy

A meeting was convened at the San Diego office between two employees of the non-profit organization Able Disabled Advocacy (AD-A) with the objective of revitalizing the existing partnership with Five Keys and gaining insight into their current service offerings. Among the array of services provided by AD-A, notable inclusions are support for facilitating a successful employment transition for veterans and individuals with disabilities. These services encompass the provision of suitable outdoor footwear, coverage of transportation expenses (including bus passes and gas cards), referrals to housing services for placement or rental assistance, digital resources to assist with job applications, simulated interview sessions, cost-effective job readiness training in IT and cybersecurity, vocational assessments, career counseling, and referrals for VA benefits. Additionally, AD-A extends its support through clothing donations or financial coverage for clothing expenses.

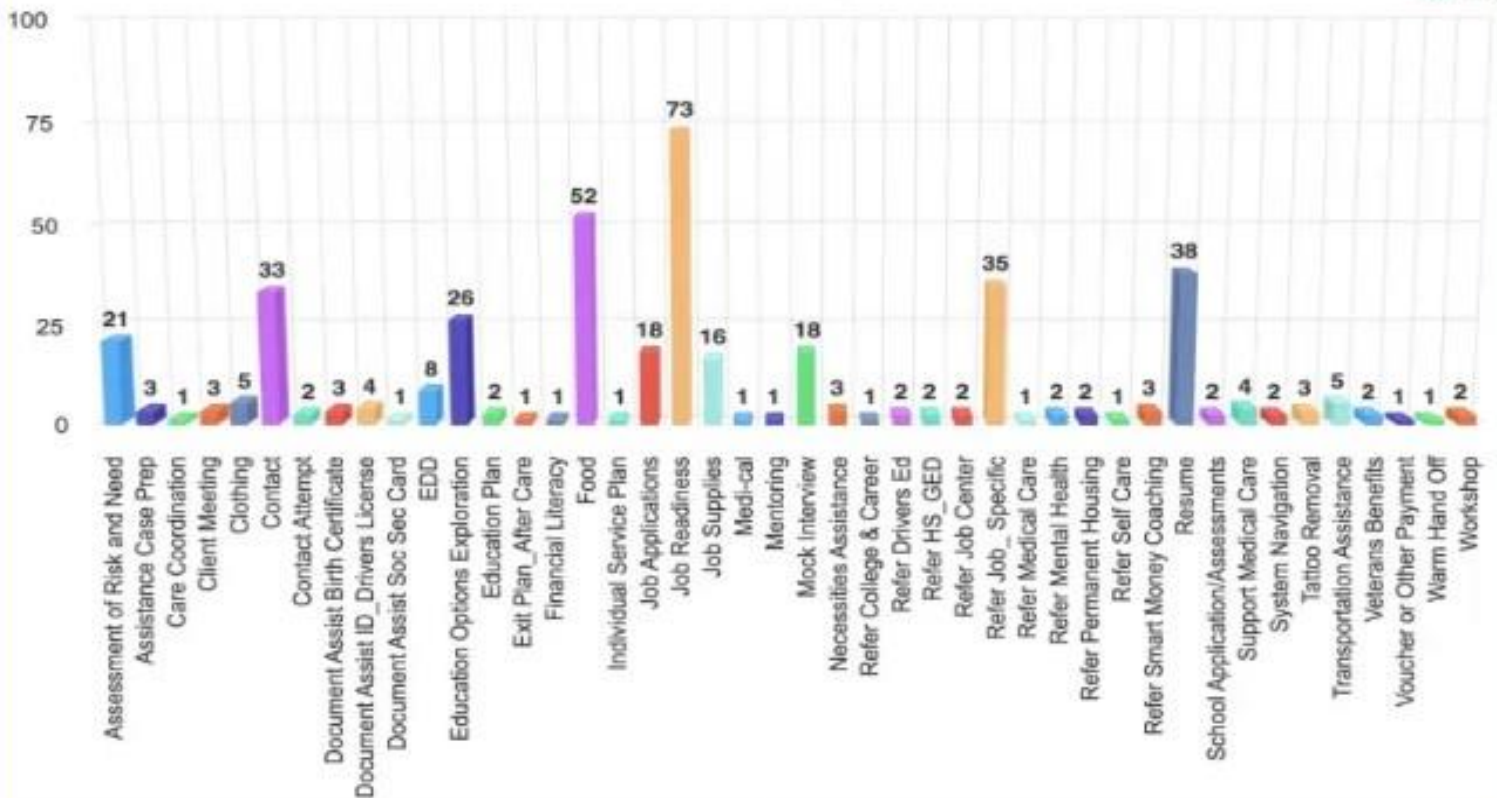
